Westlake High School 1957-1961

They are part of a former, largely unknown life of Westlake Girls High School – the founding co-ed students of Westlake High School, which split into the single-sex Westlake Girls and Boys High Schools in 1962.

Both the Westlake Schools are very pleased to have this founding group as part of our alumni communities.

There is a small active group who keep in touch and it is great to be including them in our growing alumni network. In particular, **Jan Franklin** is a great help as a key contact for the 1957–1961 group, and a source of knowledge and resources for the period. Commonwealth Games Success

Moira De Villiers, Class of 2007, won Silver in judo (70kg). During her years at Westlake she was already featuring as a top judoka in national competitions and has gone on to compete at a high level nationally and internationally.

Scholarship Success for recent graduate

Courtney Davy, Class of 2009, attended Westlake Girls High School from 2005-2009 with her passion for Chemistry beginning in Year 13 with Mrs Gatland as her Chemistry Teacher.

She studied at the University of Auckland in the science faculty, completing her B.Sc in 2012, before going on to gain First Class Honours in 2013.

Her interest in Green Chemistry was facilitated with a paid summer scholarship from the university, and based on her research work, she was nominated for an international scholarship.

As a result, Courtney has been awarded a scholarship of \$105,000 with the Pharmaceutical Trust in Ireland to enable her to complete her PhD in the field of Green Chemistry at the University of Auckland and also attend overseas conferences and research forums in 2015 and 2016.

Jenny Kirk, MNZM Former MP and City Councillor

Jenny has had an interesting and varied career as a journalist, politician and City Councillor. Now retired, she continues to be active in politics and the community, observing and commentating on a range of local and national issues.

Jenny attended Westlake High School from 1958– 1961 when it was co-ed, before it transitioned into a



girls' school in 1962. She worked as a journalist on the North Shore Times Advertiser from 1979–1983.

She represented the Birkenhead electorate for the Labour Party from 1987–1990, was a North Shore City Councillor 1995–2001, and a community board member for Birkenhead–Northcote and Glenfield.

In 2002 she was made a Member of the NZ Order of Merit for services to local body and community affairs.

Her significant community involvement includes having been CEO of the National Foundation for the Deaf and North Harbour Employment Centre, a trustee with Women's Health Action Trust, an advisor to the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Trust and a member of Northart. Jenny was a member of the Auckland Conservation Board 2003–2009, and she continues to advocate for and write about environmental issues, particularly in Northland where she now lives. From 2003–2011, Jenny was a member of the ASB Community Trust and has taken an active role in the MPEI (Maori and Pacific Education Initiatives) Pacific Reference Group.

We are proud to recognise Jenny as one of Westlake's notable alumni.

Stephanie has written an extensive range of over 50 publications with articles appearing in numerous airline Flight Magazines, expat journals, and The Jakarta Post.


Her biggest honour came earlier this year when her latest book, 'Indonesia's Hidden Heritage – Cultural Journeys of Discovery 'was launched at Museum National, Jakarta, and opened by the Vice Minister of Culture.



Stephanie got the travel bug shortly after finishing Form 6 at Westlake in 1978, saving enough to go travelling after a year and setting off with another Westlake student. Their yellow Datsun pickup truck, with Kia Ora plastered across the back was 'home' for 4 years and 56,000 kms!

This latest book is the result of many years living in Indonesia on and off, and follows 12 months exploring remote destinations there with her NZ-born husband. Her latest book has been reviewed to much acclaim, described as 'a gem'.

With her family, raised in Indonesia, now living in different parts of the globe, Stephanie and husband David are permanently based in

Yvette Rein (Perrott)

Post-doctoral researcher, astro-physicist

Yvette Perrott was at Westlake from 1999 to 2003. After her 7th form year she did a school exchange to Italy with ASSE, then returned to do a conjoint BA/BSc in Italian, Spanish and Physics at Auckland University. By the end of that, she had finally made her mind up between Arts and Science and decided to continue on with Physics.



She did a BSc(Hons) at Auckland in Physics, including a research project in gravitational microlensing, searching for extra-solar planets using the fact that distant stars can bend light and magnify another background star. She found this aspect really interesting and enjoyable and decided to pursue further study in astronomy.

She was awarded the prestigious Rutherford Scholarship from the Royal Society of NZ to do her PhD at Cambridge University in the UK, so headed there in 2010. The PhD was with the Astrophysics Group in the Cavendish Laboratory and involved using a radio telescope to study distant clusters of galaxies. These are the largest gravitationally bound structures in the Universe, and can be used to investigate the structure formation history and expansion history of the Universe.

On completing her PhD in 2013 she obtained a Junior Research Fellowship at Trinity College, Cambridge, a four year position allowing her to pursue her own research. She hopes to use this time to broaden her research interests.

Yvette met up with Roz, during her recent London visit. Yvette and her husband, Carl, (who went to Westlake Boys!) are expecting

their first child in October and plan to return to NZ after the Fellowship is finished.

ALUMNA PROFILE, Class of 1997

Roselle Thoreau

Research Manager at University College London

Roselle has been based in London for 11 years and met up with the Westlake principal, Roz Mexted there in July 2014.

Roselle left Westlake in 1997, having concentrated on Arts subjects and enjoying the cello as one of her main co-curricular interests. Her focus at the University of Auckland turned to STEM (science, technology, engineering,



maths) issues and ideas. Majoring in Psychology, she went on to complete her MA there in 2002. Her main field of interest was Ergonomics.

She headed to London shortly after graduating and has been studying and working at University College London (UCL) since 2003. She loves working in research because she is able to share her findings and make a real difference in people's lives. She has numerous publications in her field either written by herself or as collaborative reports. Her research includes road safety and disability issues, community planning research, and projects to help overcome challenges posed by an ageing population.

Working at UCL as a PhD student, Roselle has access to world renowned experts she can call on for advice. She is currently midway through a PhD, investigating issues related to older people's health and mobility and hopes to complete it in 2015.

She is an active member of the ARG (Accessibility Research Group) and Chair of TARSAN (Transport Accessibility Rehabilitation Advisory Network) in the UK and previously ran the UCL Centre for Lifelong Health and Wellbeing. Her work and leisure activities reflect her passionate interest in people's health and well-being as well as the importance of encouraging women into engineering.

Roselle has family still living on the Shore and visits from time to time.

Georgia Nicholson

Designer/Director

Georgia is a NZ designer who has recently re-located from Auckland to Sydney. This follows the success of her children's sleepwear range with her label, G.Nancy. Georgia started the label in September 2012 with 8 NZ stockists, and a small online presence from April 2013.

Her company has grown rapidly and there is now strong online demand and nearly 50 retailers around the world.



Georgia followed up her interest in clothing and design at Westlake, including organising the 2008 school fashion show, with a Bachelor of Design at AUT, specializing in menswear. Working part-time as a nanny through her studies, she decided to switch her focus to designing children's sleepwear and bedding. She has an overall focus on natural products, organic fabrics and environmentally-friendly dyes.

After graduating, she gained further experience through internships at Cybèle, Showroom 22, Sherie Muijs and Ingrid Starnes, before starting work as an assistant designer with KAF Childrenswear in Ponsonby, Auckland.

Since the setup of her own company, she has also collaborated with other designers in acclaimed and popular creations, including the illustrations of her fiancé Oli Holmes, which also feature on some of her products.

Georgia recently featured in The NZ Herald as one of our top children's designers, and she has recently featured in Homestyle, Your Home and Garden, Viva and Canvas magazines.

Her newest collection titled 'Roar' is due to launch online and in stores around the world in early September. The collection has been developed from 100% cotton jersey, printed with the softest water-based inks and made locally in Sydney, Australia. All fabrics have been dyed and printed by her team and are a completely original combination of beautiful earthy tones.



Emma Scotter (Daniel)

Neuroscientist

Emma is forging an impressive career in neuroscience research with skills honed both in New Zealand and the UK

Emma Scotter left Westlake in 1999. Her interests at school included languages and sciences and for her first step, she followed her enthusiasm for the Japanese language and headed off on



a year's exchange to Japan after completing Form 7 (Year 13).

Returning to NZ, she focused on sciences at Auckland University, obtaining a PhD in Neuropharmacology in 2009. She was awarded the prestigious Marie Curie Scholarship to enable her to do post-doctoral studies on motor neurone disease at Kings College in London where she worked for nearly four years.

In 2014, she returned to NZ as a Post-Doctoral Aotearoa Fellow at the Centre for Brain Research at the University of Auckland where she continues her work on motor neurone disease in conjunction with the Brain Research Biobank.

Her primary research interest is in modelling neurodegenerative disease in cultured cells – the "disease-in-a-dish" – in order to screen for drugs which might slow disease. With her expertise in drug screening and enjoyment of collaborative and cross-disciplinary research, she is a valuable asset to this research field back in New Zealand.

Alumnae as WGHS teachers

At last count there were 7 alumnae on the current staff of Westlake Girls and many others have taught there in the past or passed through as trainee teachers. Two are re-introduced to you here in their roles 'from the other side'.

Danielle Payne, Class of 2003

Alumna, Staff member, Committee member

Danielle is heading off in September for an exciting 10 months in France. This is a language immersion award funded by the NZ Ministry of Education and organised by AFS.

She will be based in a small town, la Roche-sur-Yon in the Loire region in the Northwest of France where she will work part time in a high school as a language assistant, and also have time to improve her French language skills.

After leaving Westlake, Danielle's passion for languages saw her complete a BA at the University of



Auckland in 2006, with a double major in French and Spanish. She spent the following year in the Rhône-Alpes region in the South East of France working as a language assistant in two collèges and a lycée.

She returned to Westlake Girls in 2010 to teach French, ESOL and English, and subsequently, junior Spanish. Danielle has been involved in two school language trips – New Caledonia and Paris, and has also had the opportunity for language immersion with three weeks in Nouméa on a programme for French teachers. This year she was appointed as Teacher in Charge of French.

She is looking forward to getting to know a different region of France and having the opportunity to be fully immersed in a culture and language that she loves. She has been a great help as part of the Alumni Association Committee since 2013.

Alumna, Staff member
