Rachel Clarke: Class of 2007

Champion Surf Ski Paddler

NZ Police Sportsperson of the Year 2014

Rachel Clarke is an ocean surf ski paddler who is currently one of the leaders in the World Surf Ski Series 2015. She has been combining her sporting career with her work as a front line police officer on the North Shore for the last 3 years.

She was recently named the 2014 Sportsperson of the Year for the NZ Police, recognising her range of sporting skills and titles she has secured over the past year.

Her love of sport was clear through



her schooling and she excelled at national level in Surf Life Saving, swimming and sprint kayaking. In 2006, in Year 12, her final year at Westlake, she was selected to compete in the world junior kayaking marathon championships in France.

From Westlake, she headed to AUT to study Personal Training, competing her Diploma in Fitness Training before joining the NZ Police.

Her sporting milestones continued through her tertiary studies and she was 1st in the NZ Ironwoman in 2009, the same year she competed in kayaking in the Youth Olympics in Australia.

2014 was a stellar year for Rachel as she claimed national titles in New Zealand and Australia: NZ Queen of the Harbour, Australia Surf Ski Champion, 'The Doctor' Champion and the Molokai Surf Ski World Champion. To win the latter, she paddled 53km from Molokai to Oahu in Hawaii. In addition she was in the NZ Squad for the World Surf Lifesaving Champs.

Rachel's 2015 season started extremely well as she won the Queen of the Harbour title in Auckland, a 27km paddle from Gulf Harbour to the Royal Akarana Yacht Club. This was the 1st event in the World Series Calendar as well as being the 3rd consecutive year she has won the title. Other events in this year's series took her to Oregon and San Francisco in early August.

Rachel has been a long-standing member of the Red Beach Surf Life Saving Club and is a Volunteer Lifeguard. Her sporting goal is to win the World Series.

Alumna Profile

Margaret Grummitt (née McIntosh)

WGHS 1968 to 1972 Gold Coast City Councillor Consul General of the Philippines for Queensland

Margaret Grummitt has lived and worked on the Gold Coast for 40 years, and is currently serving on the City Council for her third term. This follows a long career in the Queensland Police Force, where she rose to the rank of Senior Sgt. in the Prosecutions Corp at Southport, running the busiest Domestic Violence Court in Queensland.



During her Westlake days she was an all-rounder with a love of sport and music. She remembers, "I was more of a sportswoman than an academic, choosing netball in the winter and athletics over the summer months. I did enjoy the Madrigal Group that combined with the Boys' School, and was a member of the Belmont Singers, (a local youth choir). At the prize giving that year I won the Best All Round Pupil Award which was very kind of them."

On leaving Westlake she attended Epsom Teachers Training College where they were required to attend a work experience outside of training college. So I had a month at the Auckland Police Station. She says "I loved it, and that exercise changed my life. I applied to join the New Zealand Police but did not get in, so visited an aunt living on the Gold Coast where they were advertising for female recruits. I applied and spent a very happy 30 years serving on the Gold Coast."

Margaret took early retirement and stood for the local Gold Coast City Council where she is a member of the Economic Development and Major Projects Committee, the Community and Cultural Development, and a Board Member of Crime Stopper, Rotary and the Qld Prostitution Licensing."

She is also Patron of various community groups such as Gold Coast Hockey, University of the 3rd Age, Men's Shed Labrador and the Gold Coast Woman of the Year and is a strong advocate for young women entering the workforce and for disadvantaged members of the community.

Margaret is a keen water sportswoman and is active in local issues to manage and maintain amenities for the benefit of all. She is a NSW masters rowing gold medallist and a keen, passionate yachtswoman.

Margaret has recently been appointed the Consul General for the Philippines in Queensland. This is an honorary position to represent the Ambassador, who resides in Canberra.

Westlake Family links: The McIntosh Family



Margaret's brother, John, was also a Board member for about 10 years from 1979, and was Chairperson of the first Board of Trustees for Westlake Girls. Margaret Grummitt (McIntosh), featured above, continues to have a strong interest in her old school, attending the 50th Jubilee Celebrations in 2012 and the 2015 get-together in Brisbane. Her late sister, Rosemary McIntosh, was also a former student from the WGHS Class of 1978. A recent donation by the McIntosh family to assist Westlake students is greatly appreciated.

As we are now in our 58th year we are discovering more families with multi-generational links to Westlake and are always keen to hear of these connections.

What was new in '72?


 The combined drama production was 'The Travails of Sancho Panza'

Amanda Clinton: Class of 2004

Women in Engineering, University Adviser

Amanda works at the University of Auckland, encouraging and supporting females to study engineering. She works closely with high school students, university students and the faculty to ensure that women consider engineering as a future career, and are supported in their career success. Amanda also works with Professionelle, a charitable trust dedicated to the career development of women at all stages.



After leaving Westlake, Amanda completed a conjoint Bachelor of Science and Bachelor of Laws (Honours) at the University of Auckland. She then spent a year learning French in France, and rediscovered a love of teaching. Since then, she has worked at the University of Auckland in student recruitment and advice, helping senior students to decide what path of study to take, and is now based within the Faculty of Engineering.

Amanda has been lucky to visit Westlake a number of times since she graduated in 2004 – first to say hi to past teachers, and then in various roles with the University of Auckland. She was particularly touched to have been at the senior prizegiving to award scholarships in 2013 when Ms Beaver retired after 39 years of service. She also enjoys working with Mrs Weeks, who was her past dean!

Amanda remembers her days at Westlake fondly, with particular memories of the dedication of her teachers: Mr Searle (Amanda says, "thank goodness he helped me get Excellence in Mechanics, otherwise I would feel disingenuous working in the Faculty of Engineering!"), Ms Poole, Mrs Gatland and Ms Nasmyth – who she still makes an effort to come and see every time she visits the school. Amanda admits however that post-renovations, she now gets lost in the school from time to time!

The Early Years of Tennis at Westlake


Mud ponds, instead of courts, greeted the tennis enthusiasts amongst the Foundation pupils in 1957.

Community Clubs helped out and school's early tennis players used courts at Pupuke Tennis Club on Tuesday afternoons. Softball and tennis were the only two summer sport options available to girls in that first year.

Five courts were ready for use at Westlake by Term 3 the following year. Tennis was very popular, with a tennis ladder operating within the school and a tennis team taking part in the school exchanges.

Tennis was available for boys from 1959, and by 1960 the sport had grown to enable teams to be entered in junior, intermediate and senior divisions of the Auckland Competition.
