Earlier this year, just before the impact of the Coronavirus pandemic, Tracey Collins performed in the Vive La France festival in Milford, entertaining around the market place and on the entertainment stage, The same day, she travelled to Hamilton to play in an Irish band on the Waikato Explorer river boat as part of the Hamilton Gardens Festival.

Tracey Collins is thought to be New Zealand's only female professional Accordion Entertainer. She has been playing for 30 years, the past 16 years professionally, with a versatile repertoire including Mediterranean, Celtic, and Latin in a range of styles - classical, lounge or contemporary.


She left Westlake at the end of Form 6 in 1998. Her musical involvement was principally outside of school, apart from assembly performances. In her Form 4 year, 1996, she was part of the Air NZ Accordion Orchestra which toured Europe.

She has won considerable praise for her talent throughout New Zealand, Australia and Asia, and has played at events such as The America's Cup, NZ Fashion Week, Volvo Ocean Race, Food & Wine Festivals, Remuera French Festival, and the Tauranga Jazz Festival.

Jessica Satherley, Class of '01 Author, digital media specialist, yoga teacher





Congratulations to Jessica Satherley on the recent publication of her book 'Two Years in Morocco', a novella based on the time she spent living and running a business in North Africa. Jessica returned to New Zealand early in 2019 after more than a decade working in international media in London and New York, as an editor and journalist.

During her years at Westlake she was drawn to the arts and languages, having studied English, German, Spanish, Geography and Art History. She was always inspired to travel and had taken part in the German exchange programme Westlake offered, which led her to attend high school in a small town near Heidelberg for a semester.

After leaving Westlake, Jessica completed a Bachelor of Communication Studies at AUT, majoring in Journalism, before heading overseas. She worked in British newspapers while in London from 2006 – 2011 and then moved to New York for work, where she lived until 2016.

While based in New York, she continued to study part time and completed a Certificate course at New York University, 'Good Nutrition for a Healthy Lifestyle' and studied yoga, becoming a registered teacher of yoga with the American Yoga Alliance. She was also a volunteer with New York Cares, specialising in encouraging children in homeless shelters to eat healthy meals and to exercise.

After almost five years in New York, she moved to Marrakech, Morocco, where she taught yoga and created a luxury loungewear clothing brand, which was featured in The Four Seasons Hotel Boutiques in Marrakech and Hong Kong.

Jessica moved back to Auckland in 2019 and is currently a Digital Content Specialist for Westpac Bank, specialising in writing for REDnews business website, corporate photography and creating social media content. She also runs yoga classes in English and French at Alliance Francaise.

Hana Ellis, Class of '87 District Court Judge



We extend our congratulations to Judge Hana Ellis (Ngāpuhi, Ngāti Porou), Westlake Girls Class of 1987.

Judge Ellis has been appointed a District Court Judge with Family Court Jurisdiction, based in Whangārei. She was sworn in at the Manukau District Court in March this year.

She attended Westlake Girls from 1983 – 1986 together with her twin sister Ngarino, before heading overseas and undertaking extramural study at Massey University at the end of Form 6, and then heading to the University of Auckland to begin a conjoint art history and law degree.

She has family history at Westlake as her mother Elizabeth Ellis taught there as an art teacher in the 1960s and her nieces and nephew have attended Westlake also. She loved art and languages while at Westlake and was particularly influenced and inspired by her art teacher Sue McBride and English teacher Dr Pam Laird.

Judge Ellis commenced her career as a barrister in 1993 undertaking District and High Court work. She followed this with three years as a solicitor at the Māngere Community Law Centre, before working as a law firm associate for Recordon & Co for four years, practising in criminal, civil, ACC, family, tribunal and mental health matters.

From 2001 - 2010 Judge Ellis was a partner at Otene & Ellis, specialising in family law and mental health matters, as well as being appointed as Lawyer for Child and Lawyer to Assist. From 2010 she practised as a barrister in South Auckland specialising in family law and mediation.

She says that she enjoyed her years at Westlake and it gave her a stable grounding for her studies at university and the confidence to try new things and enjoy and celebrate life.

#### Erin Nayler, Class of '09 Football Fern (Goalkeeper), NZ International

Erin Nayler was one of many sporting fans celebrating recently when NZ and Australia were announced as co-hosts for the FIFA Women's World Cup in 2023. She is pictured here (left) with fellow Football Ferns Annalie Longo and Hannah Wilkinson.



Erin played football throughout her Westlake years, and her father was also a Westlake football coach. She received sporting honours and played in the NZ Secondary School team in her senior years. After graduating in 2009, she had a year studying and playing at Indiana-Purdue University, Fort Wayne, Indiana.

She says, 'My time at Westlake Girls was very memorable and it was where I really started to progress my football career. I was selected for the NZ Secondary School Team which travelled to Australia. This was the start of my pathway into the national team selections. I have great memories at Westlake Girls and the education there helped shape the person I am today. From the incredible teachers to the lifelong friends I made in the classroom and on the football field'.

Erin made her international début in 2013 and played in World Cup campaigns in 2015 and 2019. After the 2016 Rio Olympic campaign, when she was the starting goal-keeper, Erin headed to France to play, initially in Lyon, then in Bordeaux.

She returned to NZ when the Covid-19 pandemic cut the season short, and spent Lockdown training in Northland.

Erin has studied part-time for a BSc in Biological Sciences at Massey University, fitting the studies around her international career. She is also currently completing a Diploma in Health Sciences from the NZ Naturopathy College.

She hopes to soon resume playing in the Northern Hemisphere as she has signed for an English club, but hopes she can return to NZ play as a Football Fern.

We heard about Westlake alumna Toni Roberts' interview by 'Women in Industry' earlier this year, and how her can-do attitude and desire to make a real difference to the way families live, have contributed to her success.



Her Westlake years played a small part in that drive. As a female in the 80s, the journey to a career in architectural design was somewhat different to now.

She says, "Throughout my high school years, rather than picking a 'career' early, we were encouraged to gain skills and learn in a range of fields, follow what you love doing, and fed the mantra "Girls can do anything".

A knack for mathematics (pattern finding), physics (reasoning) and art (seeing), led to my desire to learn Technical Drawing which required walking into an all-boys school (Westlake) twice a week as a shy 15-year-old. Success in this led to my degree where the invaluable skills of scale, human-directed design and space appreciation were further nurtured."

After completing a degree in Architecture at The University of Auckland, and an architecture internship, Toni went on to specialise in kitchens, establishing her business "Kitchen Architecture". In 2000 she was involved in the founding of the Independent Designers Group where experienced designers still meet regularly for education, sharing inspiration and networking.

Toni recently designed a second kitchen and bathroom for an alumna friend, Sarah, from her Class of '85. Both midcentury architectural homes, the renovations have featured in prominent home magazines. Toni especially loves helping her local North Shore connections.

Toni's design projects have won several awards, she has featured in premium home magazines, conducted guest tutoring modules at Unitec, as well as sharing her knowledge at seminars.


She is now based in Silverdale in a purpose-built studio and family home that she designed, where the kitchen 'showroom' performs as a test space and physical 'experiment' of ergonomic design improvements.
