
BYOD

Uniform

First Day

Getting to and from school on the first day

Historically, school buses operate from Auckland Anniversary onwards, and there is a list of bus routes on our website under Student Life>Practical Information>Bus Timetables. However, we advise students to check the AT website at www.at.govt.nz/bus-train-ferry/timetables/school-timetables for up-to-date bus information.

Many of the public buses stop at Smales Farm, next to our school gate. Smales Farm does not allow parking for school drop off/collection and issues infringement tickets. Please organise a safe drop-off/collection point in the surrounding streets.

There are bike racks between B and C Blocks for those cycling to school. Please ensure your daughter has a lock for her bike.

Gates closed

We close the school gates daily from 3-3.30 pm for the safety of our students. You will be unable to enter (or exit) the school grounds at this time.

Year 9 students - first day (also Y13 student leaders) When

Wednesday, 29 January. Full day from 9:00 am to 3:00 pm (Note - NOT a late start like other Wednesdays).

Where

Meet in the courtyard beside the Event Centre at 9:00 am. Y13 prefects will direct students to the Event Centre area. There is a school map in this guide.

What

Activities will include Form Class assemblies, receiving timetables, guided tours (for bathrooms, lockers, canteen, library, Office, Health Centre, places to eat lunch, and classroom blocks), and an introduction to school facilities and systems, such as topping up printing cards. There will also be an opportunity for students to get to know each other in their classes.

Lockers

Once your daughter has her timetable, she can visit the Office to purchase a locker for the year (\$60). You can also pay online; see the website. Student Life>Practical Information>Payments>Lockers.

Office staff will help assign a locker best suited to your daughter's timetable. She should secure her locker with a padlock (combination or key) as soon as possible.

What to wear

From the first day of school, students must be in the correct uniform, including skirt, trousers or culottes and blouse, and sandals or shoes/socks.

What to bring

• School bag, basic stationery only (refill paper, pen), laptop, locker padlock if applicable, morning tea and lunch, and a water bottle.

Your daughter will not be allowed to leave the school grounds until the day finishes at 3:00 pm.

Start dates - all year levels

- The first day for Y9 students (and Y13 student leaders) is Wednesday, 29 January, 9:00 am 3.15 pm.
- The first day for Y10-13 students is Tuesday, 28 January (no Y9s). This includes all NEW students in Y10, 11, 12 and 13. Students will be released at approximately 11.30 a.m. Y10-13 students do not need to attend school on Wednesday, 29 January, unless they are Tuākana.
- On Tuesday, 28 January 2025, students new to Westlake Girls at Years 10, 11, 12 and 13 must go to the covered area in the quad outside the Event Centre at 9.00 am. They will be welcomed and taken to their 2025 form class.
- The first day of classes with all year levels present will be Thursday, 30 January. This will be a Timetable Day 4 (see below) All students should go to their Form Class at 8.50 a.m.

The canteen will NOT be open on 28 or 29 January. It WILL be open on 30 January.

About the school system

Here are a few helpful things to know about how our school runs.

Student ID Cards


Student ID cards cost \$8 and are essential for all students for library access and bus identification. After school photos on 17 and 18 February, form teachers issue ID cards to all students who have paid for them. No payment = no ID card. You can pay for these through the SchoolBridge portal or at the Office.

New students joining after 18 February will have their photo taken at the Office. Please report lost or stolen cards to the Office.

Attendance

If a student is sick or needs to be absent from school

It is a Ministry requirement to have an emailed explanation of a student's absence so that the correct attendance code can be assigned.



Please see the Attendance page on the website (Student Life>Practical Information>Absences) for full details about our processes for lateness, absence during the day, and what constitutes justifiable and non-justifiable leave.



In accordance with the law, students must keep phones turned off and in school bags during school hours unless there is a valid, authorised reason for exemption, such as a medical condition or when asked to use a phone by a staff member.

Students using unauthorised mobile phones will have their phones temporarily confiscated. Repeat offending will lead to more serious consequences. ASSHA Levy & Subject Contributions

Along with stationery and uniform costs, families also pay the levy for the Auckland Secondary School Heads Association (ASSHA) and learning resource costs associated with their daughter's study.

Each subject usually has a subject contribution attached to it. These contributions cover payment of some or all the following: student workbooks, photocopying and resources used to support student learning in that subject.

School donation

Our parents help provide a quality education for our students by donating to the school. We use these contributions to give your daughter opportunities beyond what the government funds, which will make a real difference to her success. This money helps with:

- Employing additional teachers and teacher aides to offer a wide range of subject choices and smaller classes.
- Updating and maintaining IT equipment, such as audiovisual gear, projectors and state-of-the-art computers.
- Technology equipment for areas such as music, sports and performing arts.
- Resources to support learning.
- Subsidising curriculum trips to the community, including teacher relief costs. These are an important way for students to connect their classroom learning to the workplace and create opportunities for future career paths.
- Extra coaching and tuition costs for sports and music. The school donation for 2025 is \$625 per student, or \$820 for families with two or more students at WGHS. The quickest method of payment is through the SchoolBridge portal, which can be accessed from the school website. For other ways to pay, see the Payments section in this guide.

The school issues the tax donation certificates on request. Feel free to contact us after 1 April and we can email this to you.

Things to note:

- Your annual donation can be a one-off payment, weekly instalments (\$12.02 single students/\$15.77 two or more students), fortnightly (\$24.04/\$31.54), monthly (\$52.09/\$68.34) or per term (156.25/\$205) via internet banking.
- While a full donation provides more opportunities for our students, we appreciate a partial donation if there are financial constraints within your family. Every bit helps.
- You can claim one-third of your full or partial donation as a tax credit.
- A donation of more than \$100 enables your daughter to receive a free Yearbook at the end of the year.
- Value option of \$820 for families with two students at WGHS. Note: the donation is capped at \$820 per year. Families with three or more students at WGHS do not pay

Your daughter benefits from the contributions of current and previous parents. Each generation 'pays it forward' to support the high standard of teaching, facilities, and opportunities we offer at our school. We invite you to help us to continue to be a school where every student can thrive.

The classroom system

Your daughter will stay in the same Form Class and House for her entire time at Westlake Girls High School. However, her subject classes will have a mix of students from across the same year level (unless she is part of the STEAM programme, in which case she will stay with the same group for all her core subjects). This is a great way for her to meet new people and make friends across a wide cross-section of the school.

Homework, assessment and exams

In Years 9 and 10, students will receive an average of one to one and a half hours of homework each weeknight. Your daughter will have tests and assignments during the year and end-of-year exams in late November. Her subject teacher will mark these based on a strict set of criteria standards determined by the school. At the end of the year, your daughter will receive either Achieved, Merit or Excellence for each subject - similar to our Senior School assessments. However, she will not receive NCEA credits. If you have concerns over assessment or testing, please contact your daughter's House Dean or subject teacher.

Parent-teacher interviews

There will be two parent-teacher interview evenings in Term One: Wednesday, 26 March, 4-7 pm and Thursday, 3 April, 4-7 pm. You will be able to book appointments through the SchoolBridge portal. You will receive details with your daughter's report, which you will access through SchoolBridge. Teachers will be in classrooms all over the school, so please allow time to walk between buildings when making your bookings.

Support

Counselling

We understand that the move from intermediate to high school is a significant one, and we have a dedicated team to support our students. The first point of contact for minor issues is your child's Form Teacher or one of the two Deans who oversee each House.

Our Counselling Department consists of trained counsellors who support our students. Parents are welcome to contact our counsellors to discuss any concerns they may have for their child. To do so, contact one of the counsellors listed.

Careers Department

From Year 9, we introduce students to diverse career possibilities through a comprehensive programme supported by our alumni network and industry connections. We help students explore future pathways, connect with tertiary providers, and prepare for job opportunities and university applications, including scholarships and overseas study. Annual events such as the Year 13 Tertiary Night, Careers Expo, and 'Career Bites' lunchtime sessions with guest speakers complement tailored support like CV preparation, interview skills, and specialised programmes for Maori (KATTI) and Pasifika (PILOT) students.

Tutoring

Departments offer free tutoring in all core subjects during lunchtimes. The times and dates will be notified in the Daily Notices (see Keeping in Touch). There is no need to book. We also offer the Smart Swans tutoring programme. Year 12 and 13 students with a high academic record volunteer their time to tutor younger students. This can be in any subject and usually begins around the middle of Term One. We will buddy students who would like tutoring with an appropriate Smart Swan. Meetings are generally after school or lunchtime and continue for as long as the students want.

Streaming

- We do not stream Year 9 students. We may invite highperforming students in Year 9 to enter an enrichment or extension class in Year 10.
- English, Maths, Science (Extension Class)
- Social Studies (Enrichment Class)

We will email you before the end of the year if we are considering your daughter for one or more of these classes. If you would like to know the level your daughter needs to achieve in Year 9 to be considered for an Extension/ Enrichment class in Year 10, talk to her subject teacher at our Teacher Parent Interview Evening in Term One.

Subject choices for Year 10

During Term Four, you will receive an email notifying you of when subject choices will be available, including instructions on making selections. Your daughter will find out on her first day in Year 10 which subject choices she has received. Generally, most students receive their first choice. Students wanting to make subject changes for the following year must do so by early December.

What is STEAM?

The STEAM enrichment programme is a two-year initiative for Year 9 and 10 students, integrating science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics to foster deep learning, critical thinking, and leadership skills through project-based learning.

The programme transitions into ESTEAM for seniors, launched in 2021, which adds Entrepreneurship and industry partnerships through the STEAM Power-ED initiative, providing work experience and bridging the youth skills gap. The programme develops global competencies like collaboration, communication, creativity, and citizenship while enriching science and mathematics with integrated projects and enhancing literacy through English and social studies. Technologies like robotics, coding, 3D printing, and virtual reality are embedded in learning.

In the second year, students collaborate with mentors to develop community-focused projects, culminating in the annual STEAM Innovation Expo, where they present their solutions to industry and the wider community. For more information, see our website (Student Life>STEAM).

How does NCEA work?

The **New Zealand Curriculum** applies to all school students, regardless of gender, ethnicity, belief, ability, background, or location. It encompasses eight essential learning areas:

- English
- The Arts
- Health and Physical Education
- Languages
- Mathematics and Statistics
- Science
- Social Sciences
- Technology

The National Certificate of Educational Achievement (NCEA) is New Zealand's senior secondary school qualification, introduced in 2002.

NCEA Level 1 at WGHS

From 2024, WGHS no longer offers the full Level 1 NCEA qualification in Year 11. This decision was made after extensive consultation and curriculum redesign.

When changes to NCEA were proposed, we surveyed Year 12 and 13 students. Their feedback highlighted both the value and challenges of Level 1:

- Success at Level 1 boosted confidence and provided valuable experience with NCEA exams.
- Common challenges in Year 11 included time management, study skills, and understanding assessment language.
- Students appreciated how Level 1 prepared them for Level 2.
- However, they felt that excessive assessments caused stress during busy periods.

In response, we reduced assessments in Year 11 and refocused courses on essential knowledge and skills.

What This Means for Students

- Flexible NCEA Integration: Level 1 assessments are included in some Year 10 courses, and Level 2 in some Year 11 courses, ensuring appropriate and meaningful learning.
- Literacy and Numeracy Prioritisation: Year 11 focuses on meeting NCEA's Literacy and Numeracy requirements while building foundations for Levels 2 and 3.
- Future-Ready Programmes: Our redesigned courses equip students for tertiary education, vocational training, or the workforce.

Bullying

We have a zero-tolerance approach to bullying at WGHS. Every student has the right to feel that they belong in our school community and to feel safe.

We understand that students may be hesitant to bring bullying to the school's attention, fearing that naming perpetrators may have negative consequences for them. However, at WGHS, our approach is supportive, proactive, sensitive, and confidential. We are committed to working with students and families to address concerns promptly and effectively, fostering a culture of kindness and mutual respect within our school.

If your child is experiencing any form of bullying at school or online, they should approach their Form Teacher, House Dean, the counselling team, or any staff member. If you have any concerns about your child's welfare, please contact their Form Teacher or House Dean to discuss the matter. If you wish to have a confidential conversation concerning counselling for your teen, please contact the HoD Counselling.

Detention

We give detentions for various reasons, including uniform violations. They occur at lunchtime or after school for more serious offences. Lunchtime detentions must be completed on the day given. After-school detentions occur on Tuesday and Thursday between 3.30-4.15 pm. Your daughter will have at least 24 hours' notice of an after-school detention. Detentions take precedence over other activities, including after-school employment. You can request our detention policy by emailing mmckerrow@ westlakegirls.school.nz.

Lost property

All property that is labelled will be returned. The Office will hold any unlabelled items.

Clubs and making friends

A great way to connect and make friends at high school is to join a club. We offer a vast number of clubs, including philosophy, writing, kapa haka, debating, anime and dance. We hold Clubs Promo assemblies at the beginning of the year and a clubs 'taster' afternoon so that everyone can try the clubs/groups that interest them.







What happens at lunchtime?

Lunchtime can feel a little daunting at the start, but there are lots of places around school to meet people, and students are always welcome in our library. Our school canteen is open at morning tea and lunchtimes, offering a range of food items that can be paid for by cash or Eftpos. Sports equipment can be borrowed from the Sports Department.

Tuākana

Each House has a group of Year 13 student leaders called Tuākana, whose role is to help the Year 9s settle into high school. They will help lost students get to class, organise form-time activities to help students get to know each other, and assist them with any queries. The kind and supportive Tuākana students assigned to your daughter's form class will be helpful for her in the early days while she finds her way around.

Google Classrooms

Google Classrooms is a crucial way of sharing information with classes. Students receive codes for each subject so they can access specific Google classrooms. There is also a Year 9 Google Classroom where information for all Year 9s is uploaded. During the 2021 lockdown, Google Classrooms was our primary way of teaching.

Communicating With Us

We deeply value the relationship we share with the parents and caregivers of our students. We also place significant importance on the well-being of our busy, dedicated staff. Your news, feedback, questions, and insights are always welcomed and appreciated.

Here are a few helpful tips to ensure your comments or questions reach the right person quickly and efficiently.

Email protocol

You are welcome to email staff members between 6:00 am and 6:00 pm, Monday-Friday. However, if you are emailing outside these hours, please use 'delay send' to ensure your email arrives within this timeframe. Staff will not answer enquiries outside these hours. Similarly, staff will not reply to emails during weekends or holidays.

Please allow at least 48 hours during the school week for a reply.

Face-to-face meetings with staff members

If you would like to make an appointment with your child's teacher, dean, or a member of the Senior Leadership Team, please request one by emailing the relevant person. If you don't have the email address you need, email the Office at office@westlakegirls.school.nz with your request. Please allow plenty of advance notice to arrange a mutually convenient time for the meeting.

Out of respect for people's time, we do not allow unscheduled meetings with our staff, so please only come to school to meet with staff if you have a confirmed booking.

Complaints process


